The month of September promises to be a month of grounding in contemplative work and peace-making.

On Sunday, September 8 th, I will be leading the church in a new sermon series, called "A Season of Peace: The Things That Make for Peace." This series will touch on the themes of:

- Recognizing the things that make for peace
- Finding peace
- Practicing peace
- Extending peace
- Living peace

The first Sunday of the series (September 8 th) will also be our "Back to Church Sunday" celebration. We will be welcoming new members into the church. And, we will be launching our new Adult Education Classes. This fall, there will be:

- a Bible Study taught in Spanish by Luis Carranza and Sara Salavarria,
- a Bible Study taught in Portugues by Thomas Hessel and the Rev. Valdir França, and
- a Mindfulness and Contemplation Book Study Series.

Keep your eyes out for more details on the first two classes. We will, of course, also continue our Sunday Morning Bible Study that happens at 10 am in the Library. All adults are welcome.

Our first book is Richard Rohr's "Breathing Under Water." I have found this book to be incredibly insightful for spiritual wellness, and hope that you find it to be so too! We will use both the book and the companion journal.
