Have you already made your new year's resolutions? Are they almost the same ones you make every year? Mine were.

May we listen deeper to what that Spirit is telling us ... maybe there is another path to be taken?



And, maybe, just maybe, as we choose our star word, maybe it will be the whisper that the Spirit needs you to hear today ...

The use of star words, also called "star gifts," is a prayer practice connected to Epiphany and the new year that has been growing in popularity in Protestant churches for nearly a decade now.

The idea is that a list of intention words, or guiding words, are written on paper stars.

These paper stars are then arranged, most commonly face down to be chosen.

On Epiphany Sunday, you will be invited to draw a word from the Table, and to use that word as a guiding word throughout the year.

You are encouraged to trust the word you have drawn, and not to replace the word.

And I invite you to place you star word somewhere where you will see it regularly throughout the year to allow consistent reflection on how God has moved through, around, or in connection to that word.

And, if you can't make it to worship on Sunday, January 5th, you can find the star words in a special spot in the entryway (the Narthex) of the Sanctuary.

In accordance with Jim Davis' gift, we continue to support the Lomagundi Clinic in Zimbabwe. Elders Grace Moore and Leslie Wallace, along with Deacon Yvonne Moyer, participated in a Zoom conference with our partners at Wellshire Presbyterian Church in Colorado to learn more about the clinic's current needs. A \$5,000 donation was sent to help purchase critical medical equipment for the maternity hospital.

Chapman Partnership received an additional donation to purchase food and gift cards for the kitchen staff.

SafeSpace received a donation to purchase much-needed towels and bed sheets for their residential units.

A committee member purchased a large quantity of canned food, rice and beans, eggs, boxed food, milk, cheese, pasta, and breakfast cereal for **Pass It On Ministries**.

The committee sent \$1,000 to **PCUSA** (FLA) to assist in recovering from Hurricane Helene and Milton. We also sent additional funds to our partners, **Frontera de Cristo** in Arizona and **House of Hope** in Haiti.

New Year in the Spirit of G.A.

A reflection of how the 226th General Assembly's vision can inspire our congregation in 2025

The year has turned; welcome to 2025. The festivities have faded, making way for a new, though always apprehensive, beginning.

Our congregation has grown stronger in spirit, and we will continue to grow in 2025. This year is pivotal for the church: the Pastor Nominating Committee's ongoing work, installation of new Elders and Deacons, and fresh ideas from members will shape our path. After adapting through challenges, 2024 marked our most impactful year since the pandemic began. We have rediscovered what it means to be a faith community, and 2025 promises even more.

Last year, the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) hosted its 226th General Assembly in Salt Lake City, where congregations deliberated on faith, justice, and mission. Last year, the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) hosted its 226th General Assembly in Salt Lake City, where congregations from across the nation deliberated on topics of faith, justice, and mission. I had the humbling privilege of representing MSPC as a Young Adult Advisory Delegate, alongside members of the Presbytery of Tropical Florida. Witnessing the Spirit at work affirmed that our church is alive.

Why do I mention these decisions?

These two actions reflect core values of our congregation: **unity and inclusion**. They align with MSPC's mission of "Worshipping God. Welcoming All. Building Community." The Olympia Overture calls us to love boldly and protect gender identity and sexual orientation, urging us to embrace Christ's love through welcoming strangers and supporting the marginalized. The Condemnation of Christian Zionism reminds us that justice requires honesty, education, and listening to silenced voices. Justice is lived through daily choices, and these decisions are seeds requiring constant care.

As a congregation, what will we make of them in 2025?

In order to "Live into Hope," we must act. Progress is not made out of idle optimism. It must come as a result of a restless, resilient faith that calls us to heal, grow, and build. May we then fulfill the mission our Lord has given us: to love the Lord our God with all our heart, soul, and mind, and to love our neighbors as ourselves. Together, let this be our sole purpose.




